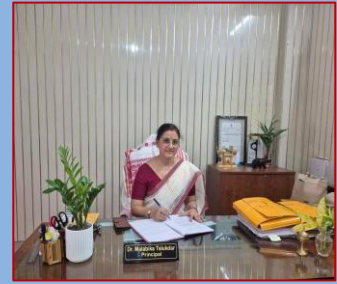

About the College

The history of Jnanadabhiram Borooah (J.B.) Law College is a story of vision, perseverance, and the collective commitment of distinguished citizens who believed in the transformative power of legal education. The institution traces its origins to 1968, when a group of eminent educationists and public-spirited individuals met to discuss the establishment of a science college at the premises of Kamrup Academy, following the upgradation of Kamrup Academy High School into a Higher Secondary School. Although permission to start the proposed Science College was not granted by Gauhati University, the discussions brought to light another pressing educational need: the lack of adequate opportunities for legal education in Guwahati.

At that time, many deserving students were unable to secure admission to the Law Department of Gauhati University, as the evening classes posed considerable difficulties for working professionals. Recognizing this gap and inspired by the initiative of Sri Badan Chandra Deka, a fresh meeting was convened on 10 July 1968. The members unanimously resolved to establish a law college at Kamrup Academy, marking the beginning of what would become one of Assam's most respected institutions for legal education.

An ad hoc Governing Body comprising eminent lawyers, educationists, and community leaders was immediately constituted to guide the establishment of the college. Under the leadership of Sri Satyendra Kishore Ghosh as President and Sri Golap Chandra Choudhury as Secretary, the Governing Body worked tirelessly to fulfill the requirements prescribed by Gauhati University. The authorities of Kamrup Academy generously permitted the proposed college to function from their premises, providing invaluable support during its formative years.

The founders embarked on an extensive public fundraising campaign to meet the university's conditions for affiliation, which included the creation of a reserve fund, adequate infrastructure, and a well-equipped library. Lawyers, philanthropists, businessmen, and distinguished citizens from across Assam contributed generously, reflecting widespread public support for the institution. Equally significant was the contribution of members of the legal fraternity, who donated valuable collections of law books that laid the foundation of the college library. These collective efforts enabled the college to secure the necessary affiliation from Gauhati University.

Jnanadabhiram Borooah Law College formally commenced its academic journey in the 1969–70 session with the introduction of the Preliminary Law Course. The response from students was overwhelming, with 478 students enrolling in the very first academic session. The college soon established its academic credibility through encouraging examination results, with several students securing university distinctions. These early achievements not only enhanced the institution's reputation but also strengthened public confidence in its mission of providing quality legal education.

As the college expanded, the Governing Body sought permission to introduce the Final Law Degree Course. University regulations required every law college offering the Final Course to possess its own campus. After considerable effort, the college acquired land at Zoo Road, opposite Commerce College, Guwahati, from Sri Purna Chandra Bharali, proprietor of Kitap Ghar, Panbazar, who not only sold the land but also made a substantial financial contribution towards the development of the institution. Although construction of the permanent campus could not be completed immediately, Kamrup Academy continued to accommodate the college for several years, a gesture that played a crucial role in ensuring its uninterrupted growth.

The college continued to expand steadily in both academic strength and public recognition. Applications were submitted for the introduction of higher law courses, while increasing student enrolment reflected the institution's growing popularity. Alongside academic development, the college nurtured a vibrant intellectual and cultural environment through the active participation of its Students' Union, the publication of the college magazine Jnanada, and the dedicated service of its faculty members.

It is also important to note that a significant milestone in the institutional development of the college was achieved in 1983 with the registration of the J.B. Law College Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The formation of the Society provided the college with a strong institutional foundation and facilitated its continued academic growth and development. Since then, the Society has played a pivotal role in guiding the college in its pursuit of academic excellence while preserving the vision and ideals of its founders.

Thus, over the decades, Jnanadabhiram Borooah Law College has evolved into one of Assam's premier centers for legal education. Built upon the dedication of its founders, the unwavering support of the legal fraternity, the generosity of countless well-wishers, and the commitment of its teachers and students, the college continues to uphold the ideals of academic excellence, integrity, and public service. Its enduring legacy stands as a testament to the collective vision that transformed a humble initiative into an institution of lasting significance in the history of legal education in Assam.

4. Creating legal awareness for all sections of society by conducting seminars, symposiums, workshops, law lectures and legal aid camps. The College is also committed to provide free legal aid services to the needy people through its Legal Aid Clinic under the supervision of District as well as State Legal Services Authorities.
5. Encouraging students to participate in all kinds of extra-curricular activities in order to inculcate their inherent talents and groom their personalities.
6. Organizing and encouraging students to participate in moot court competitions whether national/international in order to imbibe the techniques and skills of advocacy.

Location

The main campus of the college is located in the heart of Guwahati city, Kamrup (M) district, in a beautiful location on R.G. Baruah Road, near the Anandaram Baruah Flyover, just opposite Gauhati Commerce College. Guwahati is considered the gateway to the North-Eastern states and is well connected by rail, road, and air transport with other parts of the country. At present, Guwahati is one of the prime academic hubs of North-East India. Recently, the college has taken up an additional campus at Bamunimaidan, Guwahati – 781021.

The present address for all kinds of correspondence is the main campus, Chandmari, Guwahati – 03.

Campus

The college has its own campus on R.G. Baruah Road, Chandmari, opposite Gauhati Commerce College, with multi-storied R.C.C. buildings housing classrooms, teachers' common rooms, an auditorium, a moot court room, a library, a canteen, etc. The campus is under CCTV surveillance.

Facilities Available

Library

There is a well-equipped library within the campus with a spacious reading room facility for both students and faculty members. The library is sufficiently equipped with the latest and updated editions of law books, reference books, journals, periodicals, etc. It is managed by experienced staff who cater to the academic and intellectual needs of students and teachers. Internet facilities with SOUL 2.0 version and OPAC are available for students in the library. The online legal research database Manupatra is also available. Every student is expected to avail themselves of the library facilities for their academic and personality development.

A student shall deposit library caution money as security, for borrowing books and journals in the library Reading Room.



Moot Court Hall

The college has a contemporary moot court hall for the development of professional skills and knowledge of students. The moot court hall was constructed with the financial aid of Shri Amaresh Ch. Goswami in the memory of his son, Late Partha Pratim Goswami. The college organizes an annual state-level moot court competition, the "B.R. Ambedkar Annual Human Rights Moot Court Competition," on the occasion of World Human Rights Day, which is observed globally on 10 December.



Computer Lab

The Computer Laboratory of J.B. Law College is a well-equipped, air-conditioned, and managed Computer Station that serves as a central hub for teaching and learning, research-related activities, preparing computer-related & other projects, etc. It promotes digital literacy and fosters a collaborative learning environment. It provides access to the students and staff to the available technological assets, enhancing both classroom instruction and independent learning. In this academic institution, the Computer Lab serves as a base for educational activities, gaining research-related insights, feasible through internet & online services, and other institutional & administrative tasks; offering students, faculty members, and even the non-teaching staff, the admittance to technology and digital resources. The IT infrastructure facilitates learning through various methods, including hands-on practice, project-based work, presentations, and interoperability with multiple online learning platforms.



Conference Room

The College has a conference room to accommodate formal meetings of the college. The space enables discussions related to college affairs, teachers' meetings and other academic meetings in a comfortable environment.

Seminar Hall

The Seminar Hall of the College with a seating capacity of 100+ students is routinely used for seminars, lecture sessions and other activities. It is equipped with projector facilities for an enhanced learning experience.

College Auditorium

The College has an auditorium with the seating capacity of 250+ students. The auditorium offers a stage to the young students to hone their talent, communication and performing skills. It has been witnessing to many college events-cultural and academic.

Boys' Common Room and Girls' Common Room

The College has a designated space for its students to relax socialize and study with washroom facilities.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The college provides elevator facilities for easy access across all five floors.

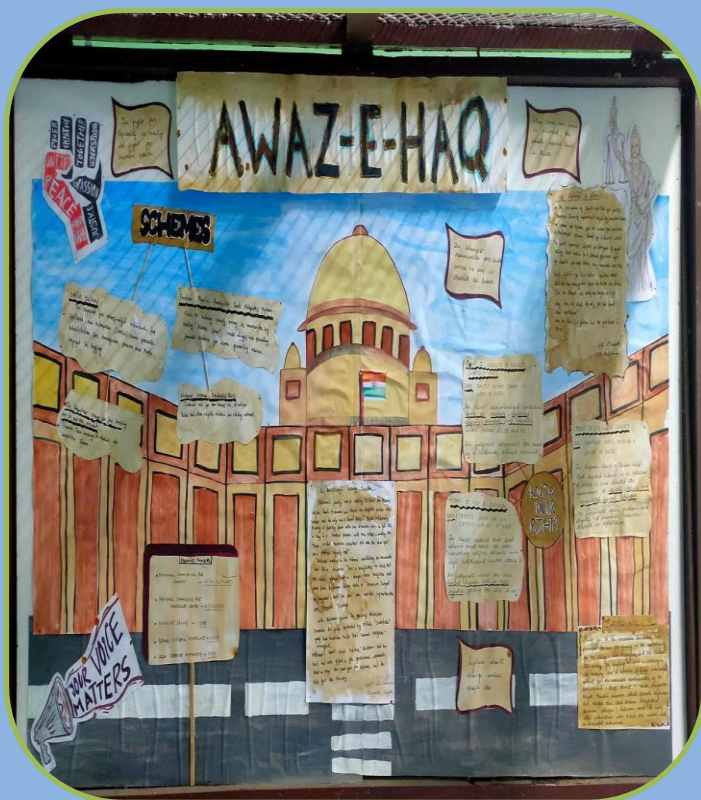
Scholarship

The magazine is published annually and is edited by students under the supervision of the Journal Committee, headed by the Convenor of the Committee.

The college has a research journal named JNANDEEP, in which research articles written by retired judges, advocates, and law teachers from different universities and law colleges are published.



Students' Union Room

The J.B. Law College Students' Union is the general body of the students of the college. Its membership is compulsory for every student admitted to the college. The Union endeavors to foster and promote fraternity, mutual understanding, and a sense of responsibility among students. The Students' Union annually celebrates College Week as "AEQUITAS" in order to promote the inherent talents of students in various fields of co-curricular activities such as games and sports, debates, literary works, cultural and social activities. The Union also takes initiatives to organize free legal aid camps and legal awareness camps in underdeveloped areas at different locations.

Legal aid Cell/Room

The College has a permanent Legal-Aid Clinic to give legal aid to the poor and needy people. Under the supervision of State Legal Service Authority or District Legal Service Authority, the students take part in the process of legal aid clinic. Legal awareness programmes and legal aid camps are also organized to activate the Legal Aid Clinic.

Each Sessional Examination shall be of **1 hour** duration and carry a total of **20 marks** in each paper. Internship for 5-year B.ALL. B. course will be for minimum period of 20 weeks and for 3 Year LL.B. course it is for a minimum period of 12 weeks.

Student's Conduct and Discipline

A. Identity Card: Every student is issued an identity card at the time of admission. The card, which is non-transferable, contains information about the holder, such as name and address, session, class, roll number, etc. It also contains a passport-size photograph of the student, endorsed by the Principal. It is essential for every student to carry the identity card with him/her so that it can be produced whenever necessary.

B. Attendance: Attendance in classes is strictly compulsory. A student must attend not less than 70% of lectures. Students whose class attendance falls below 65% will forfeit all privileges of a student and will be considered non-collegiate students as per university rules.

C. Examination: Examinations are normally held according to the academic calendar for the law course published by G.U. The examinations are held on the college campus.

D. Maintenance of discipline among students:

Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building. Students are required to maintain the highest standards of discipline and shall abide by the disciplinary rules of the college as mandated below:

The courses offered at J.B. Law College are full-time courses.

- Students must maintain absolute silence in the college library, where they are expected to spend their spare time/recess period without disturbing the work of others.
- Students must be punctual in attending their classes. Any deviation from this rule will be intimated to their parents/guardians.
- Students' societies and associations shall be subject to such rules and regulations as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- Any notice intended to be pasted or circulated by students anywhere in the college premises must have prior approval of the college authority. Further, any student found using the name of the college on any public platform/social media without prior approval will be strictly penalized.
- Any immoral or indecent act, violence of any kind, disobedience to college authorities and teachers, damaging, defacing, or destroying any college property, acts against public sanitation, or any act intended to cause public nuisance, disturbance of public tranquillity, communal trouble, or breach of public peace shall attract punishment and disciplinary action.
- All powers relating to the maintenance of discipline are vested in the Head of the Institution, and her decision shall be final in all such matters.
- The college campus is a tobacco-free zone, and violators are liable to be punished.
- In cases of gross indiscipline, a compulsory transfer certificate may be issued by the authority.
- No student will be allowed to enter the college campus without the prescribed college uniform. Furthermore, no student will be allowed to attend any non-academic activities in college uniform outside the campus. Violation of this clause will attract strict disciplinary action.
